## PUPIL PREMIUM SPENDING PLAN, APRIL 2019

## **ALLOCATED FUNDING**

In April 2019, Chadlington CE Primary School received £30,360 in pupil premium funding. This was based on pupil numbers in the January 2019 census. The total pupil premium funding allocated to the school in 2019 was awarded to provide additional support for 23 'Ever 6' pupils.

## PLANNED EXPENDITURE

The current spending plan aims to overcome the following barriers to achievement, identified in April 2019:

- Emotional difficulties compromise some pupils' ability to learn because mental health and social problems need to be addressed;
- Due to a range of complex problems the attendance of disadvantaged pupils does not meet the school's target for attendance.
- A number of disadvantaged pupils in the EYFS and KS1 have not reached the expected levels of language development for their age group and this inhibits their ability to access age-appropriate learning.
- Some pupils have limited aspirations due to the restricted opportunities that they receive as a result of financial constraints.
